
Fore-shortening





What is Fore-shortening?

- Making a three-dimensional object in a picture seem to recede in space by shortening the depth dimension is called FORE-SHORTENING.
- We've already seen how this works with boxes and blocks, but what about people as subjects?










FORESHORTENING - Lines or surfaces parallel to the observer's face show their maximum size. As they are revolved away from the observer, they appear increasingly shorter.
